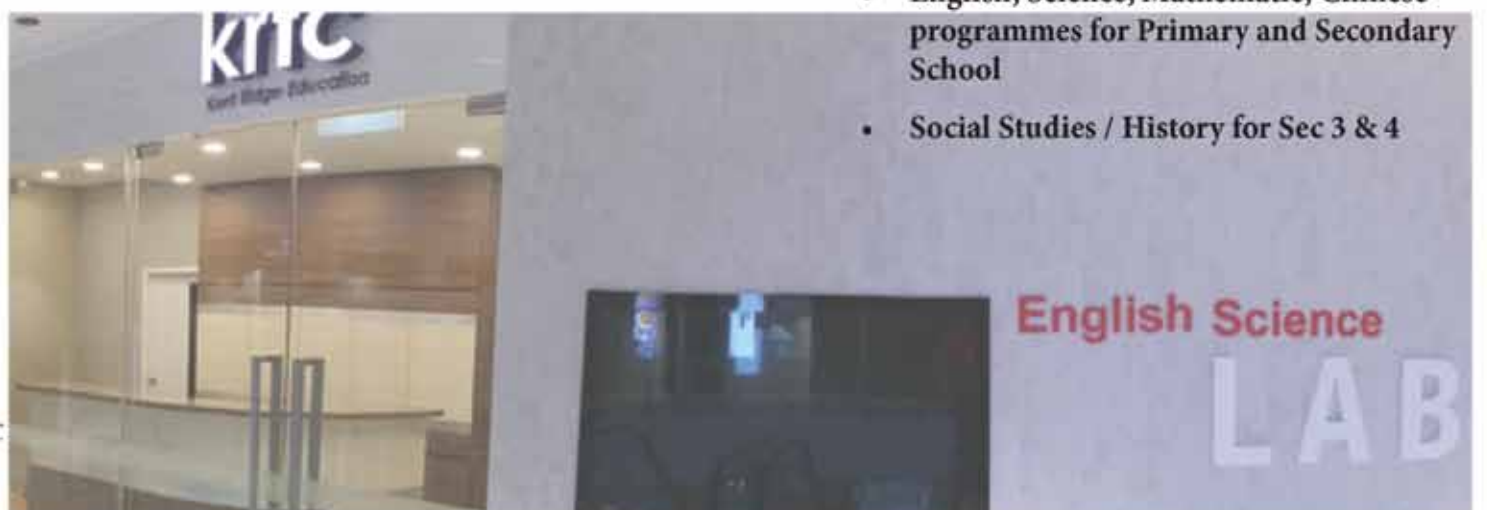

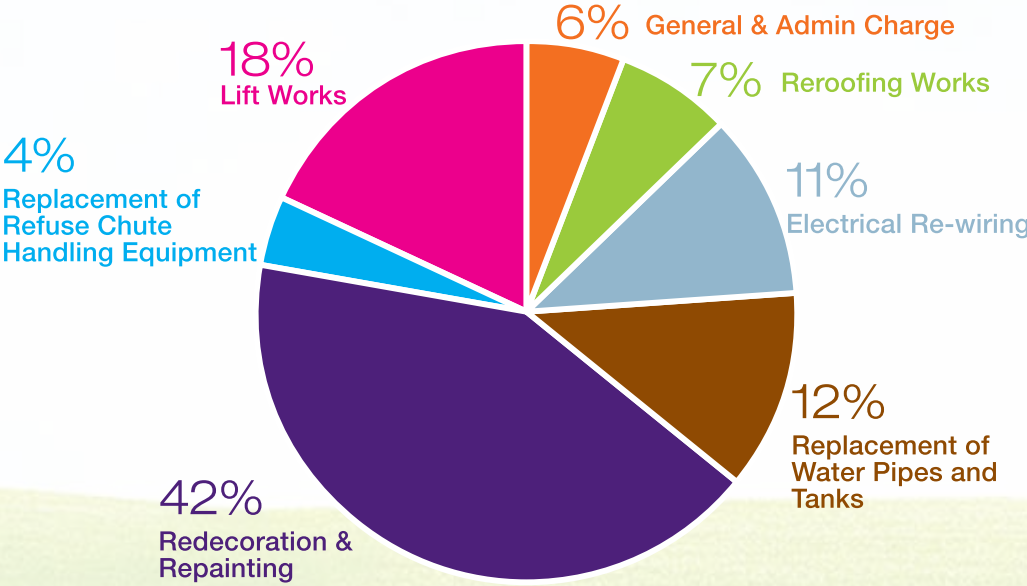

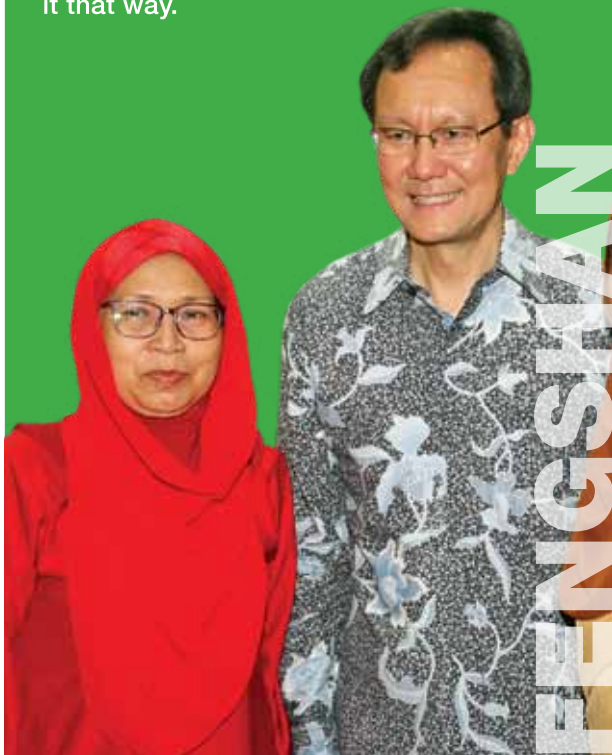
In close partnership with residents and community partners, working to build and maintain a conducive environment in the East Coast Town to meet the needs of residents is the focus of the East Coast Town Council.

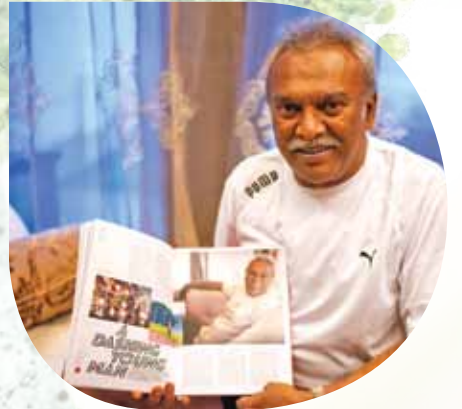
SG 50 PIONEERS IN OUR TOWN

Mark Twain once said, "Age is an issue of mind over matter. If you don't mind, it doesn't matter." Senior residents can take a leaf out of these featured pioneers' books and start living an active, meaningful life!

MR ABDUL WAHAB HASSAN
67



MR ABDUL SALAM

Strong and sturdy, Mr Abdul Wahab Hassan, 67, was a larger than life character in the neighbourhood. Well-known for his altruistic spirit in volunteer work, he has received numerous plaques in recognition of his active involvement in the community. At Kampong Chai Chee Ruby Residents' Committee, he is involved in a range of activities such as brisk walking and recycling. Every quarter, he will also conduct night inspection, looking out for choked drains, fused bulbs and broken pipes.

When asked about the most memorable event in his line of work, he recounted that two years ago, there was a philanthropist who wished to donate a few hundred wheelchairs. As Mr Abdul Wahab Hassan was a familiar face in the precinct, he was tasked to identify those residents with the most pressing needs of mobility. Knocking every door from Blk 130 to Blk 140, Bedok North St 2, he interviewed from home to home, ensuring those who really needed the wheelchairs received it. Though gruelling, it was a labour of love. In total, ten residents received the wheelchairs. All were unable to stand for long periods of time. Mr Abdul Wahab Hassan cited old age and weak legs as the main contributing factors. Suffusing with exuberance as he spoke, one realise alleviating the daily discomforts experienced by a person does bring immense joy, both to the giver and the recipient.

Most people tend to associate failing health with the elderly, but the moment they see Mr Abdul Salam, 66, they will realise how wrong they are. One will be surprised at the sports he is doing now. Preparing for 100m and 200m sprinting, long jump and triple jump competition is part of his daily routine. Ever since he was in Gan Eng Seng Secondary School, he was an avid sportsman. He was nearly called up to the national team, but had to go for national service instead.

Over his 42-year career in Singapore Airlines and Singapore Airport Terminal Services, he continued to race, participating in corporate athletics meets. In the past few years, he represented Singapore in Masters Competition. As he opened up, he recalled one particular event which etched in his memory. In a 4x100m relay in the 35-39 age category, he was asked to be the last runner. At that time he was already 55 years old. With all the odds stacked against him, he still managed to come in second!

He ended off the interview with a quote, "I will continue running as long as my legs will take me." Indeed, he is the role model for the silver generation, pushing himself to achieve his personal best despite his age.
